

WHY Project ECHO JJBH?

- Expand access to best-practice behavioral healthcare for system-involved youth (e.g., juvenile justice, child welfare, foster care).
- Provide opportunities for peer and communitybased learning and support.



WHAT is **Project ECHO JJBH?**

• Tele-mentoring model to build providers' capacity to deliver best-practice behavioral healthcare to system-involved youth. Includes specific mentoring and support on providing telehealth services.

HOW does Project ECHO JJBH work?

- Providers from multiple locations connect at regularly scheduled times with a team of specialists using Zoom videoconferencing.
- Sessions feature case-based learning and short, engaging didactic presentations.
- Licensed and non-licensed providers are welcome.
- No cost to participate.
- Licensed participants receive Continuing Education Units (ACCME, CAMFT, and CCAPP)
